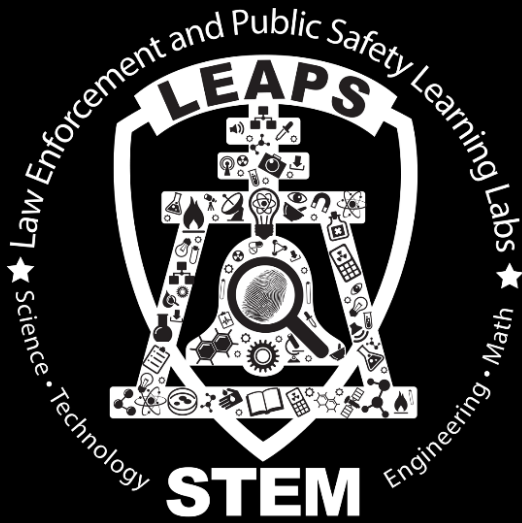

Careers in law enforcement and public safety require increasing levels of STEM proficiency. To address this important need, these programs have been developed by the Science & Technology Education Partnership (STEP), Riverside Unified School District, the Riverside Police & Fire Departments & Bourns, Inc., with lead funding from the Motorola Solutions Foundation and support from Wells Fargo, NAVSEA Corona, Vocademy & Brilliant School Apps.

Sixty high school students per each week-long Learning Lab session will receive free hands-on training, including the use of robots for surveillance and neutralization of threats, collection and utilization of crime scene evidence, analysis of big data, communication of findings for the prevention of crime and threats to public safety, disaster preparedness for hazards that may impact their area and trains them in basic disaster response skills, such as fire safety, light search and rescue, team organization, and disaster medical operations.

STEP is pleased to offer these innovative Learning Lab programs to Riverside Unified School District students from Ramona, North and Arlington High Schools and to Woodcrest Christian High School.
